

Basic Color Mixing

- Start with just a drop or two to adjust the color.
- To lighten use white.
- To darken use black. Be careful with black, using too much can muddy the color.
- Always allow the tinted color to dry before adjusting it.
- Most colors dry darker than what they look like they are wet.
- It's best to tint in daylight conditions not in artificial light.

COLOR MIXING

Primaries - The three basic colors.

A=Red



B=Yellow



C=Blue



Secondaries - these are achieved with an equal mixture of two of the three primaries.

Orange



A+B

Green



B+C

Purple



C+A

Intermediate - these are created by mixing two primaries in a ratio of 2:1.

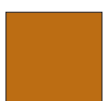

Tertiaries - these are created by mixing the three primaries together in different percentages.
